

Henry Lawson (1867 -1922) was the leading Australian writer of his generation, as reflected in being given a â ^state funeralâ <sup>™</sup> on his death in 1922. Often contrasted with his contemporary â ^Banjoâ ™ Paterson which resulted in the â ^Battle of the Bardsâ ™ being conducted in â ^The Bulletinâ ™; Henryâ ™s dour (realistic) depiction of life in the new western lands being in contrast to Banjoâ <sup>™</sup>s rural idyll. In their verse newcomers, like me, quickly learn how the Aussie 'Can Do' culture was formed that has come to define the modern nation. Unlike the classic English poets such as Wordsworth, Keats and Shelley, Australia's bush poets are largely drawn from the grass roots (working class) of the new society telling their tales as entertainment for the new Australians. Hugely popular during the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries these bards are little known outside Australia; which is our loss? Through the publication of 'Australia's Bush Poets' as Kindle Editions I hope that you to will come to enjoy and share this 'Can Do' heritage. Here you'll find struggle, loss, pain and gritty reality mixed in with liberal helpings of Aussie humour; I leave it to you to make the pick.
