A very helpful summary of key international tax concepts and rules. It is a much easier read than some other tax supplements and includes illustrative examples. I found it a very helpful review before my exam and will probably keep it around as a reference.

I bought this as a law school supplement. For that purpose, it's ok. It does give very good, in-depth explanations of various topics. But I was hoping for something that would quickly distill international tax into the essential concepts (like a Glannon supplement would do), and it failed to do that. Somewhat wordy, and technical. But... it's tax law. We all knew the subject was going to be wordy and technical. So, I can't fault the book too much for not being able to distill the Rube-Goldberg machine that is international tax into a digestible format. Probably worth the investment if you're a

practitioner.
